Speaking of powers that be – but this time not quite at the godly level – I can report that several current and former officers of the Grand Lodge attended our Pacific Southwest District convention at the Hilton in Woodland Hills last week. The Grand Master, William Lundquist from Michigan, made an appeal for money to replace part of the loss incurred in last year's scandal when funds in excess of one million dollars disappeared. Lundquist moved to have our District donate an annual percentage to the Vasa Archives. However, after some discussion this matter was tabled until all members of our District could be informed. There was no mention of earlier assertions that some of the lost funds would be recovered. It appears that this possibility is very remote. Consequently the scholarship program at the Grand Lodge has been suspended indefinitely. I wish to emphasize that none of the accounts in our Building Corporation or in the Golden Valley Lodge have been affected by this scandal. Our own scholarship program will continue as will the one sponsored by our District. At the convention it was a pleasure for me as GVL-chairman to present a check for \$2,000 in support of four scholarship funds managed by the District. Two bright GVL-members, Christina Thelin and Anders Heinstedt received their awards at the banquet on Saturday

So what's happening next at our Lodge? Well, I have great news for you – Karin Coleman has promised to cook dinner at our Thursday, March 10 meeting. The menu is secret but I'm sure you won't be disappointed. Cultural leaders of the month are Birgitta Clark and Karin Altankov.
